- **Successful PRRAC interns/externs will walk away from the experience with a foundational understanding of housing law and policy in the United States through a distinctly racial justice lens.** Assignments and expectations will be modeled after the day-to-day practice of a Housing Policy Counsel. PRRAC is committed to centering the students' education throughout the internship program by focusing weekly supervision session on meeting the student's stated goals.
- **Past interns have substantially contributed to research and writing projects** relating to housing policy including policy briefs, comment letters, journal articles, tracking new social science research, amicus briefs, and legislative advocacy. Students also have the opportunity to join meetings led or staffed by PRRAC staff including coalition calls and strategy calls with advocacy partners.
- Ideal candidates are law students with strong research and writing skills with a passion for civil rights.
